## **Reporting Waste for Open Multi-dose Vial Products**

Per CDC guidelines, Open/Punctured Multi-dose vial products must not be returned to McKesson. When reporting waste of an open vial of IPOL, Fluzone, or Pfizer, providers must select the "Wasted" wastage type, to prevent receival of a return shipping label. Open/Punctured vials must then be disposed of as medical waste according to practice protocols.
