Immunizations Before Summer Travel

Encourage families planning summer travel to get caught up on immunizations at least a month beforehand. Protect patients against <u>measles</u>, <u>pertussis</u>, and other diseases causing recent outbreaks. If you do not stock certain <u>travel vaccines</u>, direct patients to a <u>travel medical clinic</u>.

MMR Vaccination Guidance Reminders

Before international travel

- All ages: up to date measles vaccination
- Ages 6-11 months: 1 dose before departure, then routine 2-dose series
- Age 12 months and older: First dose now, 2nd dose 28 days later

Before domestic travel

For people who live in or visit domestic measles outbreak areas, some state and local health departments might recommend:

- Early MMR dose at age 6-11 months
- 28-day interval between MMR dose 1 and 2
