



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Put Measles on the Spot



The measles outbreak in Texas and New Mexico has resulted in multiple hospitalizations and one confirmed death - and continues to spread. The outbreak reminds us that measles is very contagious but can be prevented by timely vaccination. Make sure to recall and vaccinate patients 12 through 15 months of

age with their first dose of MMR and children 4 through 6 years of age with their second dose.

Infants 6 through 11 months of age who are traveling internationally should receive an early, extra dose of MMR vaccine.

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Flu Levels are Still High! Recall Children Who Still Need Their 2nd Dose of Flu Vaccine

Children 6 months to 8 years old need two doses of flu vaccine this season if:

- They are getting flu vaccine for the first time
- They have previously received only one dose of flu vaccine, or
- Their flu vaccination history is unknown.

Recall pediatric patients who still need their second dose using this template patient portal message:

"Flu is still high—protect your child now. Your child is due for their 2nd dose of flu vaccine. Call us at (XXX) XXX-XXXX to schedule your child's immunization visit."
