The United States is experiencing its highest rate of measles infections in decades. As of May 12, over 1,000 cases have been reported across 31 states, and 3 children have died as a result of complications from the virus. Amid this widespread and dangerous outbreak, health care providers, public health practitioners, and members of the public need to know how to protect their patients, communities, and loved ones.

- Symptoms of measles and how it is diagnosed and treated
- How to share accurate information about the virus
- The challenge of vaccine hesitancy and declining immunization rates
