MMR Doses Before International Travel

Protect your patients now against possible exposures to measles by vaccinating them with MMR vaccine **ideally at least 2 weeks before their international travel:**

- · Infants under 12 months old who are traveling
 - Get an early dose at 6 through 11 months
 - Follow the recommended schedule and get another dose at 12 through 15 months and a final dose at 4 through 6 years
- Children over 12 months old
 - Get first dose immediately
 - · Get second dose 28 days after first dose

- Teens and adults who do not have evidence of immunity against measles
 - Get first dose immediately
 - Get second dose 28 days after first dose


Talk to your patients about other <u>vaccines before traveling</u>, such as influenza, COVID-19 and RSV.

2025 VFC Recertification

Annual recertification is a federal requirement to remain enrolled in the VFC Program and continue receiving federally purchased vaccines. The anticipated recertification launch date is the week of December 16, 2024. The anticipated due date is **Friday, February 14, 2025**. **DO NOT WAIT** to complete the recertification process. Allow ample time to complete the required EZIZ lessons and the online Recertification Form.

New Fact Sheets: Seasonal Vaccines for Farmworkers

New fact sheets are available for farmworkers in <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> with information about how to protect yourself and your family with flu and COVID-19 vaccines. Everyone 6 months and older should get both flu and COVID-19 vaccines. Those that work with farm animals like poultry and cows are at higher risk for getting bird flu. Getting the flu vaccine helps lower the risk of getting both the seasonal flu and bird flu at the same time and getting very sick with multiple viruses.

Novavax Update

Current Novavax COVID-19 vaccine lots have a 12/31/2024 expiry. To minimize vaccine wastage, order enough vaccine that can be utilized within the expiration date. Novavax is still in the process of requesting a shelf-life extension for these lots. We will update providers as soon as more information is received.

Grant Opportunity for 2025

The CDPH Immunization Branch is announcing a Request for Applications (RFA) for a grant to assess and improve adult immunization rates in Community Health Centers (CHCs).

CDPH is seeking Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) or look-alikes to assess immunization levels and implement quality improvement activities in an identified adult patient population.

There will be 2 awards of \$130,000 each for funding through June of 2025. Applications are due Friday, January 10, 2025.
