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Next Week! Crucial Conversations Webinar: Effective Communication Without Confrontation

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MMR Vaccination Reminders

Rising measles cases remind us that measles vaccines are critical. For children, follow the <u>routine schedule</u>:

• 2 doses, 1st dose at 12 – 15 months of age, 2nd dose between 4 – 6 years

For children traveling internationally:

- Age 6 11 months: 1 dose before departure; revaccinate with 2-dose series starting at 12 – 15 months
- Age 12 months and older: First dose immediately, second dose 28 days later



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Reminder: Continue Administering RSV Immunization through March 31



Please continue recommending and administering the RSV immunization to eligible infants and toddlers until the end of March. RSV immunization is the best way to protect our youngest patients from severe illness and hospitalization.

As a reminder, providers may check the California Immunization Registry (CAIR) or ask the birthing parent to download their digital vaccine record at myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov to verify receipt of prenatal RSV vaccine. For more information, see our RSV FAQs and resources.

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Continue Ordering Flu Vaccines to Protect Patients

It's not too late – everyone 6 months and older should get the updated flu vaccine

to prevent severe illness and hospitalization. As flu continues to circulate at significant levels, please use every opportunity to strongly recommend flu vaccines using the presumptive approach:

"I see that you [or your child] have not yet been vaccinated against flu. We'll
make sure you get the vaccine before leaving the clinic today."

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Update to JYNNEOS Emergency Use Authorization (EUA)

Emergency use authorization for JYNNEOS was updated on December 23, 2024. FDA removed the requirement that use of JYNNEOS under EUA is limited to doses supplied by the Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR). Under EUA, JYNNEOS purchased on the commercial market or supplied by ASPR can be administered to:

- Individuals less than 18 years of age determined to be at high risk of mpox infection when two 0.5 mL doses are administered subcutaneously 4 weeks apart.
- Individuals 18 years of age and older determined to be at high risk of mpox infection when two 0.1 mL doses are administered intradermally 4 weeks apart.

Additional lots of JYNNEOS are authorized to be kept at +2°C to +8°C for up to 8 weeks after thawing. Note that this is different from what is on the <u>package insert</u>. Refer to <u>Expiration Dating Extension | FDA</u> for more information.
